SEN Referral and Identification

Cause for concern

Referrers: parents/carers, any member of staff, external agencies, pre-defined needs i.e. upon initial entry to school/info from previous setting



Information gathering: Ensuring that parents/carers give permission for and are fully informed at all stages, the Inclusion Manager gathers information from all relevant persons and through her own observations, on the presenting concern. She then explores what provision is currently in place for that child. If further differentiation is needed or if there is a temporary circumstance in the child's life that needs special consideration (e.g. the birth of a new baby), then this is factored in. If however the child clearly needs something different from and additional to what is provided for the rest of the class and over a longer time span, then this child may be considered as having special education needs.

Child's Special Educational Needs identified or explored further

School Action (SA): It is agreed with parent/carer that their child will be supported at SA on the school's SEN register. This means that the school will make reasonable adjustments to provision for the child to support the particular concern that the child presents e.g. a child who may be isolated and struggles with friendships may benefit from a social skills group or 1:1 time with the Learning Mentor.

School Action Plus (SA+): Agreed with parent/carer that child will be supported at SA+ on the school's SEN register. This means that the parents give permission for an external agency to support the school's provision for their child, through assessment, advice and recommendations. Any external agency is accessed through a Common Assessment Form (CAF), which the Inclusion Manager will explain and jointly fill in with the parent/carer
