Sports Premium Report 2017 – 2018

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing £150 million in additional funding per annum until 2020 for primary schools in the UK. The funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on sport and PE provision. Schools are required to demonstrate how they have used the funding to deliver additional resources, which will promote participation, progress and attainment in PE.

The school is required to publish information on the school website about how the grant has been used and the impact it has had.

How much Sport Premium income has the school received?

Each school receives a lump sum of £16,000 per annum plus £10 per pupil on roll in Years 1-6. For the 2017-18 academic year, Heber Primary School is forecast to receive a total of £19,630.

How has the school used the funding?

High Quality Teaching

The primary investment for the school has been to employ a part-time trained PE specialist teacher, whose role is to oversee and develop sporting provision for all pupils and to track their progress. This improves the quality of the PE teaching on offer during the core school day.

This core teaching is supported by the following specialist sport experiences within the school day:

- Swimming lessons for KS2
- Cycling proficiency for KS2
- Dance workshops from Perform
- Regular use of Alleyn's field for outdoor sport lessons

Our Specialist PE teacher also enhances sport provision across the school teaching team by providing specialist sport CPD to other teachers.

These experiences are designed to ignite passion and enthusiasm for a range of sports, some of which our pupils may not have had the opportunity to try before.

London PE & School Sports Network

Using the premium, the school has also joined the London PE and School Sports Network. This full membership programme is designed to support the school in key development areas that have been identified during the course of this academic year.

The programme includes:

- Membership to Youth Sport Trust, which provides national policy updates, advice and guidance.
- Enhanced team teaching support including professional CPD and sharing of best practice.
- Revised Sport Specific Schemes of work
- Access to the Gifted & Talented programme
- Access to competition programme including 5 major events per year
- Access to National Governing Body programmes & events
- Access to the membership area of the LPESSN website, which includes the sharing of best practice from other member schools.
- Playground Leaders Programme delivered through one day conferencing.

Special Sport Events and Inter-School Participation in Competitive Events and Tournaments

Our pupils participate in a wide range of sporting events, both within the school day and as extra-curricular activities.

- Tag Rugby Competitions both league and festivals
- Cricket Matches
- Local schools Football League tournaments
- School football, netball, rugby and cricket team – weekly training & school tournament fixtures
- Whole school Annual sports day at Alleyn's
- Heber Fun run at Dulwich Park
- Cross country competition
- Multi skills festival for KS1
- Friendly matches with local schools

Participation in these events encourages interaction and higher levels of performance and sportsmanship for the more gifted pupils by competing against schools across the borough of Southwark and beyond. This programme also includes a range of inclusive events which are about fun rather than competition, such as our hugely popular fun run.

After School Clubs

In addition to our core school day offer, we ensure our pupils have access to a range of after school sport clubs such as football and athletics. We have engaged the services of Millwall Sports Community Trust to help us deliver these sessions for high quality specialist coaching.

Links

The school has strong links with partner organisations to aid event participation:

- Burgess Sports, which includes Peckham BMX, Southwark Tigers rugby, Southwark city tennis, Southwark All Stars, Burgess park cricket club and Lynn boxing club.

Impact on Participation and Attainment

We will evaluate and report on the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation and provision mapping arrangements. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways. We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school. Assessments are made both formally and informally using our school assessment systems as well as feedback from staff and visitors to the school. We will also evaluate the impact of professional development opportunities in improving teaching and learning in PE.
